ID:- AYU0004) with 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal-regarding.

## Sir/Madam,

- This is with reference to the first appeal vide letter ref. no. 164/ACAD/ALGACW/2025 dated 23.08.2025 filed by you enclosing an undertaking cum affidavit vide BS 172785 dated 22.08.2025 submitted by the Dr. Christina Z. Chongthu, IAS, Secretary, Health Medical & Family Welfare Department, Telangana to the Commission against the order passed by the President, MARBISM vide letter of even no. dated 26.07.2025 with regards to issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the Academic year 2025-26.
- 2) In view of the above, the Chairman, NCISM decided to accept the submission made by the Dr. Christina Z. Chongthu, IAS, Secretary, Health Medical & Family Welfare Department, Telangana against the impugned order dated 26.07.2025 passed by the MARB-ISM.
- 3) Further, a letter vide ref. no. 51-46/2025-26/Comm. Appeal/College (Ayu.) dated 11.09.2025 has been received from the Secretary, NCISM directing the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to grant permission to Anantha Laxmi Govt. Ayurvedic College, Labour Colony, P.O. Laxmipura, Narsampet Road, Distt. Warangal, Telangana-506013 (Inst. ID:- AYU0004) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 as per concerned act and regulations on the basis of undertaking cum affidavit submitted by Dr. Christina Z. Chongthu, IAS, Secretary, Health Medical & Family Welfare Department, Telangana.

## "DECISION"

- 4) Therefore, in view of above, Anantha Laxmi Govt. Ayurvedic College, Labour Colony, P.O. Laxmipura, Narsampet Road, Distt. Warangal, Telangana-506013 (Inst. ID:- AYU0004) is hereby granted with:
  - a) Yearly Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.
- 5) The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
  - (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 50 seats (63 Seats including EWS) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
- 7) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.
- 10) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-27 :
  - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
  - iv) The remaining visitation fee as communicated in the letter dated 28.01.2025.
- 11) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
